

Timeline of Records: George Markham and wives Hill and Osborne

1771; Francis Smith Jr of Hanover county deed from Benjamin Watkins, Vincent Markham and George Markham, executors of John Markham dec'd for 200 pounds current, 200 acres in Chesterfield county adjoining lands of Brett Randolph, dec'd, Robert Gordon, Olive Branch, Stephen Pankey and Buckingham Road . . . 25 June 1771.

1772; Benjamin Watkins, Bernard Markham, Vincent Markham, George Markham, exec of John Markham, dec'd to Richard Crump, selling land whereon the said John Markham, dec'd lived, containing by estimation six hundred and ninety six acres be the same more or less and bounded by the known and reputed bounds thereof (no description given); 11 Dec 1772. Note that on that same date, DB 7 pg 43, Richard Crump then conveys this land to Vincent Markham.
